The Society wants to employ two veterinarians for the programme..

Job Specification for veterinarians

The selected person should have a first class bachelors' degree from recognized university/institution in Veterinary Science. The candidate should have interest in wildlife conservation and should be prepared to do work independently. Persons with extensive clinical experience in working with wild birds and animals will be preferred. The candidate should be physically fit as the job involves lot of field work.

Job Description: The job will involve looking after the health of the captive vultures and also carrying out safety testing of drugs. It is a very challenging job and will give opportunity to work with the best in the field internationally.

Age: Below 32 years
