Vacancy: Veterinarians for Free-ranging Dogs Sterilization/ABC Programme (No. of post: 5)

Details about the job opening: The Bombay Natural History Society is working on free-ranging dogs mitigation through sterilization/ABC programme in bordering areas (Changthang Wildlife Sanctuary, Karakoram Wildlife Sanctuary and Drass) of Ladakh under the project “Biodiversity monitoring and conservation with Indian Army” to conserve the endemic and endangered wildlife in the region. BNHS requires veterinarians at these.

Job Specification for Veterinarian: The selected person should have a first-class bachelor’s or master’s degree from recognized university/institution in Veterinary Science. Should have one year experience of working of Wildlife health. The candidate should have an interest in wildlife conservation and should be prepared to work independently. Persons with extensive clinical experience in working with free-ranging dogs and wild animals will be preferred. The candidate should be physically fit for the fieldwork in remote locations.

Job Description: The job will involve free-ranging dogs’ sterilization/ABC programme in border outposts in Ladakh.

Age: Below 40 years

Place of work: Leh, Changthang Wildlife Sanctuary, Karakoram Wildlife Sanctuary, Kargil and Drass

Remuneration: Rs 400/- per dog on field work basis.

Duration: 6 months (extendable)

Experience: One year of experience in treating animals, preferably free-ranging dogs.
