

Wildlife Watch From Hide

The BNHS Conservation Education Centre (CEC) Mumbai invites you to enjoy the peace and calm of the dense forest of Mumbai from a hide. This opportunity gives you a chance to listen to the melody of nature and a chance to observe behaviour of some shy forest birds and even some wild animals!!

This is a fund-raising initiative for the BNHS Conservation Education Centre (CEC), Mumbai.

Dates: 1st January 2023 till 28th February 2023

(1st March to 31st March 2023, hide timing will be till 06:00 pm)



Rules/ guidelines:

- 1. The hide is behind the centre, we currently have five chairs for each slot.
- 2. Advance information to CEC and confirmation of your session is compulsory.

3. Fees Rs.300/- for a session in the hide from 07am to 11am or 02pm till 05.30 pm. This includes entry fee to CEC, camera charges or parking charges. The session timings may change as per sunset timings (Number of hides may also change).

4. Keeping quiet is of utmost importance for watching wildlife from a hide. Otherwise, the chances of seeing any wild animals/ birds diminish.

5. BNHS do not guarantee the sightings of any wild animal or bird species during the session in hide. Every sighting entirely depends on the silence maintained and luck.

Be a scientist for a day (Kids special) Sunday, 15th January 2023

Have you ever dreamt of to becoming a scientist?

The Conservation Education Center of BNHS gives you an opportunity to get into the shoes of a scientist and wear the hat of a data collector, for a day! On the day we will be learning about how scientist conduct research about trees, birds and butterflies. You as a participant will get to learn to observe, record and analyze the data in a scientific manner. This will sharpen your analytical and observation skills, which are useful for wildlife studies. You will learn to use field guides, data sheets, camera traps, GPS units and nature journaling. The survey will address three research parameters; species diversity, species abundance and species seasonality. The programme is open to 10 to 18 years old with basic computer skills. Certificates will be given to all those who successfully complete their activities. We hope this experience will inspire to become a wildlife biologist and naturalist.


Special Trail (Free) on the occasion of 'World Wildlife Day' Saturday, 4th March 2023

CEC Mumbai Rules and Regulations

- CEC is open from 07:00 am till 05:30 pm. Staying back after 05:30 pm in CEC premises is strictly prohibited.
- Entry fee for BNHS Non-members on weekdays is Rs. 150/- and on weekends and public holidays is Rs. 200/-.
- BNHS members carrying valid BNHS membership cards (hardcopy) are exempted from CEC Mumbai entry fees. Anyone without a valid BNHS membership card will be treated as non-member.
- Private groups are supposed to inform and confirm about their visit with names and total number of participants to CEC, three days prior to the visit.
- Payments can be done in advance for visits of private groups (Contact CEC for further details).
- All visitors are supposed to follow the existing nature trails only, to avoid trampling and damage to the flora and fauna.
- Littering or throwing any kind of garbage is prohibited.
- Any kind of unethical and illegal behavior in the CEC campus won't be tolerated.
- Collecting anything which belongs to the forest is illegal and prohibited (flora and fauna).
- Entry to any rooms (except washrooms) in CEC without permission is strictly prohibited.

How to reach CEC

- If you have a private vehicle, you may directly come to BNHS Gate Number one (Location is given below)
- If you are taking public transport: Take a bus number 343 headed to Dadasaheb Phalke Chitra Nagari aka Film City (not Santosh Nagar) from Goregaon (East) BEST depot. Alight at the last stop, opposite Reliance Media Works and walk straight (don't turn right). Along this narrow-tarred road, walk past the small Waghoba (Tiger Deity) temple situated on the right side. Immediately ahead you will see a BNHS gate (Number Two) on the right side. After passing through this gate, a five-minute walk along a demarcated nature trail will bring you to the CEC building.
- If you are coming by a rickshaw, you can directly reach BNHS CEC through gate number one. (Location given below)
