

## INDIAN SKIMMER COUNT (PHASE I) JANUARY 2023-REPORT







The aim of the Indian Skimmer Count is to gather information about the Indian Skimmer Rynchops albicollis population across its distribution range. It is conducted in two phases by Bombay Natural History Society (BNHS) in association with Bird Count India. This is the third year of this initiative and in January 2023 the event saw participation from birdwatchers, citizens & photographers

from India & Bangladesh. They surveyed various sites and contributed the valuable data.
